late 19	943	Built by Messerschmitt at Augsberg, as evidenced by `Krj' on the manufacturer's plate on the fuselage. Given manufacturer's radio call sign PD + VO (still painted in the cockpit). This sub-type had provision for a ventral weapons container with an additional pair of 20mm canon. The RAE erroneously records Air Min V1/Air Min 72 as Werk No 410478.
May	45	Surrendered at Vaerlose, Denmark. Unit at this time not known, although paint stripping at Cosford in the 1960s showed evidence of previous codes 3U + AK and (later) 3U + CC of 2 Staffel, I/ZG26 (Zerstorer Geschwader 26) which had served in the Balkans and Italy. Possibly also coded at one time PD+VO with 2./ZG26. One of the last fighter units to operate the Me410 was IV/ZG26, based in Norway, which was renamed II/JG5 `Eismeer' and re-equipped with the BF110 in February 1945, by which time the only front line Me410 flew as reconnaissance aircraft with Luftflotte 6; the RAFM aircraft may have served as a communications 'hack' in Norway with 11./ZG26 by late 1944, initially at Gerdermoen and later at Oerlandet.
09 Jun	45	Selected for evaluation by Gp Capt Hards and initially painted as `Air Min V-1' (V for Vaerlose) - one of at least six Me410s acquired for evaluation in the UK.
20 Aug	45	Flown from Vaerlose to Kastrup by Sqn Ldr Ian Somerville. Force landed at Kastrup at end of ferry flight with one engine on fire after an oil tank burst.
25 Aug	45	Flown again following repair.
03 Oct	45	Flown Kastrup - Schleswig by Sqn Ldr McCarthy.
13 Oct	45	Ferried from Schleswig to RAE Farnborough via Gilze-Rijen by Sqn Ldr McCarthy. Observed at Farnborough as Air Min V1 two days later but not test flown.
28 Dec	45	Flown from Farnborough to No.6 MU Brize Norton for storage.
May	46	Selected for preservation by Air Historical Branch.
14 Aug	46	To No.76 MU Wroughton, Wilts for museum storage.

Presumed to have passed to No.47 MU Sealand upon closure of No.76 MU.

In store at German Air Force Equipment Centre, No.3 MU, RAF

Stanmore Park, Middlesex by this date.

Late 1955 To No.15 MU Wroughton with rest of AHB collection.
